krinó: to judge, decide

Original Word: κρίνω

Part of Speech: Verb

Transliteration: krinó

Phonetic Spelling: (kree'-no)

Short Definition: I judge, decide, think good

Definition: (a) I judge, whether in a law-court or privately: sometimes with cognate nouns emphasizing the notion of the verb, (b) I decide, I think (it) good.

Matthew 7:1 (NIV1984) *"Do not judge, or you too will be judged."*

ANAKRINO

anakrinó: to examine, investigate

Original Word: ἀνακρίνω

Part of Speech: Verb

Transliteration: anakrinó

Phonetic Spelling: (an-ak-ree'-no)

Short Definition: I examine, inquire into

Definition: I examine, inquire into, investigate, question.

1 Corinthians 2:14-15 (NIV1984) *The man without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually discerned. 15 The spiritual man makes judgments about all things, but he himself is not subject to any man's judgment:*

DIAKRINO

diakrinó: to distinguish, to judge

Original Word: διακρίνω

Part of Speech: Verb

Transliteration: diakrinó

Phonetic Spelling: (dee-ak-ree'-no)

Short Definition: I distinguish, discern, doubt, hesitate

Definition: I separate, distinguish, discern one thing from another; I doubt, hesitate, waver.

1 Corinthians 6:5 (NIV1984) *I say this to shame you. Is it possible that there is nobody among you wise enough to judge a dispute between believers?*
